- 4. How many arks were there? How many doors were there in the ark?
- 5. What does Jesus say about salvation in John 14:6?
- 6. Read 2 Peter 2:5. What else do you think that Noah was probably doing while he was building the ark?

Section 2 Genesis <u>7:1-16;22;23</u>

- 7. When the flood began, where were the people who had faith and where were those who did not have faith? How many people were in the ark?
- 8. Where did the water come from?
- 9. Who shut the door of the ark? Why do you think this is important?
- 10. What can we learn about God's judgement from this passage?

Section 3 Genesis 8:1-5; 18-22

- 11. On which mountain did the ark land?
- 12. What is recorded as being the first thing that Noah did after he left the ark? Why do you think he did this, and how did God feel about Noah's action?

Section 4 Genesis 9:1-17

- 13. What was the key command that God gave Noah and his family?
- 14. What changed about man's diet?
- 15. Did God make any promise to Noah? If so, what was it? What do rainbows tell us?
