Luke 7:1-23

Introduction and Background

Jesus returned to Capernaum where He encountered a Roman officer. Perhaps it surprised the disciples that Jesus would even talk to a Roman, but this man was respected by the Jewish leaders and had even built a synagogue. The Roman centurion has an important question for Jesus. Later, Jesus visits Nain and raises a young man from the dead. Finally, two of John the Baptist's disciples bring questions for Jesus.

- 2. Who was sick and who was the Roman? (2)
- 3. What did the Roman do? Why do you think this was unusual? (3)
- 4. How did the Jewish elders describe the Roman to Jesus? (4-5)
- 5. Why did the Roman officer change his mind and what did he expect Jesus to do? (6-8)
- 6. What was Jesus' response and what did He do? (9-10)

Read Luke7:11-17 The Widow of Nain's Son

- 7. Where did Jesus go next? Why do you think He kept visiting different towns? (11)
- 8. What was happening when Jesus arrived in the town? (12-13)
- 9. What emotion did Jesus show and what did He say to the woman? (13)
- **10.** Jesus raised the young man from the dead. How did He do it? Why do you think that Jesus chose to raise this young man from the dead? (14-15)
- **11.** How did the people respond? (41-42)

Read Luke 7:18-23 John the Baptist's Questions.

- 12. Why do you think that asked if Jesus was the Messiah? (18-19)
- **13.** Jesus told John's disciples to go back and tell John everything that was happening. Why do you think that He didn't answer John's question? (21-23)
- 14. Can we decide if Jesus is the Messiah by examining what He said and did?
- 15. Do you believe that Jesus was the Messiah? What makes you sure?
