Our Daily Walk with Jesus

Our walk with Jesus is an ongoing journey. We spend time talking with Him and He, in turn, communicates with us.

In this lesson we will begin to learn that it is important that we spend time in prayer and in reading the Bible. These are the primary ways that we connect with Jesus. Learning to have a consistent, regular time with the Lord can be one of the great joys of the Christian life.

- 2 Read [II Peter 1:20-21](#). In your own words, describe how the writer of the Bible got the words to write. Do you think it is important where the words in the Bible come from? Why?
- 3 What title is given to Jesus in [John 1:1](#)? What do you think it means that Jesus is given this name?
- 4 Read [Matthew 24:34](#) and [Isaiah 40:8](#). What do these two verses teach us about the word of God?

The Bible and our Growth as Christians

- 5 What does Jesus compare the word of God to in [Matthew 4:4](#)? What happens if we don't eat? What happens if we don't read the word of God?
- 6 What drink does Peter compare the Scriptures to in [I Peter 2:1-3](#)? What happens to newborns if they don't get milk?
- 7 What is God's Word described as being like in [Psalm 119:105](#)?
- 8 Read [Colossians 3:16](#). Do you think that God's word is "dwelling among you richly?" How can God's word "dwell" in you? How can we use the Scriptures to help each other?

Using the Word of God

- 9 Read Ephesians 6:16-17. What does this passage teach us about the word of God as a weapon? How should we present ourselves to God according to [II Timothy 2:15](#)?

- 10 Read James [1:21-23](#). What does James say we need to get rid of? What does James say about our attitude to the word? How does James use the example of a mirror?

- 12 What does David teach us about the connection between sin and prayer in [Psalm 66:18](#)? What do you think that this teach us about unconfessed sin and answered prayers?
- 13 Read [Ephesians 6:18](#). According to the Apostle Paul, how often should we pray?
- 14 When did the Psalm writer pray? [Read Psalm 5:3](#). What did he do after he prayed?
- 15 What does James tell us about prayer? [James 5:16](#)
- 16 What does Jesus teach us about prayer in [Matthew 21:22](#)?
- 17 Read the passage known as the Lord’s Prayer from [Matthew 6:9-13](#). What does the Lord teach us about prayer in each verse?
